22/161. DECLARATIONS OF DISCLOSABLE PECUNIARY AND OTHER INTERESTS

No declarations of disclosable pecuniary and other interests were received.

22/162. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Written apologies for absence were received and accepted by the Council from Mr A J Barton, Mr M G Callam, Mrs B Cook, Mr R J Knowles, J H Mallen, Mr N Shaw and Mr G T Tingle.

22/163. RESIDENTS' QUESTIONS

On the motion of Mr W F Couzens seconded by Mrs J Leggett it was **RESOLVED**, that the meeting be adjourned to receive residents' questions on matters concerning the town. Residents were reminded that their questions should be addressed to the Chairman who would, assisted by the Town Clerk, reply.

Mr M Moore asked if a vending machine selling drinks and snacks could be provided at Sprowston Diamond Centre.

Mr W F Couzens advised that it was a Council decision and would be considered at a future meeting.

Mr Moore also enquired if additional dog fouling signage could be placed in suitable locations around the town.

It was agreed the Town Clerk arrange for additional and replacement signage to be placed in dog fouling hotspots.

The meeting was reconvened.

22/164. MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council's annual meeting held on 18 May 2022, having previously been circulated to all Councillors were confirmed and signed by the Chairman of the Council.

22/165. ACTION FROM MINUTES

(1) Planning Press Notice

Further to Minute 22/135 the Town Clerk reported Broadland District Council will be advertising planning applications in the press on Thursdays.

(2) Reports from Council's Committees and Working Groups

Mrs B J Lashley asked what plans were in place for advertising the Sprowston summer fete.

In response the Town Clerk advised there was an advert in the next issue of Sprowston Matters, to be delivered shortly. Banners will be erected on Sprowston Diamond Field and Sprowston Recreation Ground. Details of the fete were already on Council's Facebook and website and would also be placed on Council's noticeboards. An article will also be placed in Just Sprowston.

RESOLVED to advertise Sprowston summer fete in the Eastern Evening News and or Eastern Daily Press subject to it being free to do so.

22/166. PRESENTATION - SPROWSTON HERITAGE

Bev Woolner explained there was too much work for one person to research, write, edit and publish articles on behalf of Sprowston Heritage. Assistance was required to check facts and carry out research. He appreciated this would be a voluntary role however emphasised the right candidate must have the appropriate skills for the position.

It was agreed Mr Woolner would prepare a Job Specification and the Town Council advertise for a volunteer.

Mrs B J Lashley mentioned Voluntary Norfolk advertised voluntary roles. She also suggested approaching Norfolk Family History Society to ascertain if they could advertise the post.

The Chair invited Councillors who would like to be involved in Sprowston Heritage to contact the Town Clerk.

The Chair thanked Mr Woolner for all his hard work.

22/167. TO RECEIVE CORRESPONDENCE

(1) Changes to Police Newsletters

Mrs B J Lashley commented that suggested changes were not very inclusive as everything in the document referred to accessing information on-line. Not everyone was confident browsing websites on the internet.

22/167. TO RECEIVE CORRESPONDENCE (CONTINUED)

Mr W F Couzens agreed to raise this point during a conference call arranged with the community police.

Mrs B J Lashley said she would be interested to know how thinly stretched policing was across the area in which Sprowston was included.

(2) Consultation on Draft Broads Plan 2022 - 27

RESOLVED that Councillors respond on an individual basis to the Draft Broads Plan 2022 - 27 Consultation.

(3) Consultation on Norfolk County Council Local List for Validation of Planning Applications

The Town Clerk explained that Norfolk County Council was legally obliged to give applicants a list of all documents necessary to accompany a planning application submitted to them.

RESOLVED that Councillors respond on an individual basis to the Norfolk County Council Local List for Validation of Planning Applications Consultation.

(4) Norwich Western Link Project Update

Council noted the Norwich Western Link update.

The Town Clerk was requested to notify Councillors when Norfolk County Council's Cabinet report on the Norwich Western Link became available.

(5) To consider grant request from the National Accident and Rescue Services (NARS)

RESOLVED that a donation of £100.00 be made to the National Accident and Rescue Service to ensure their life-saving charity remained operational, in accordance with the Council's powers under section 137 and 139 of the Local Government Act 1972.

22/168. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

A written report was received from Mr J M Ward.

Mrs K Vincent verbally reported:

- (1) She had reported an overgrown hedgerow adjacent the bus stop on White Woman Lane having received concerns from residents
- (2) The Old Catton Deer Park was registered as an asset of community value on 8 June 2022. The consultation is due to end on 3 August 2022 when a decision will be made.

22/168. REPORTS FROM COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS (CONTINUED)

She is supporting the Deer Park Action Group with their endeavours and has launched a petition encouraging people to sign it against development on any part of the deer park.

One of the organisers of the action group would potentially like a stall at Sprowston summer fete to raise awareness.

Enquiries for stalls at Sprowston summer fete to be sent to the Town Clerk.

Mr J M Ward responded to questions regarding his written report as follows:

- (1) The First Homes Pilot Scheme 30% discount was paid for by the developer.

It was noted this could lead to a reduction in the provision of social housing elsewhere.

- (2) Whilst it was traditional to appoint a chairman to the Overview and Scrutiny Committee from the opposition party this had not always been the case and the District Council Leader appointed the best person for the job.

- (3) Cherwell was in Oxfordshire.

- (4) Vacancies occur on County Farms as tenants retire or move to bigger holdings outside the county.

Mrs Vincent clarified the element of the deer park referred to in her verbal report was adjacent to Moore Avenue, Burma Road, Spixworth Road and the Warren.

Mr W F Couzens expressed his disappointment that the new Chairman of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee was not from an opposition party as this would offer a valuable balance for the District Council.

22/169. TRAFFIC DATA

- (1) School Lane, 2021 December, facing traffic from Chartwell Road

- (2) School Lane, 2021 December, facing traffic from North Walsham Road

Council expressed concern at the validity of the December data as the SAM2 had been obscured by parked lorries.

- (3) School Lane, 2022 April - both directions

Council noted that April data highlighted a majority of vehicles travelling from North Walsham Road were exceeding the speed limit whereas a majority of vehicles travelling from Chartwell Road were within the speed limit.

22/169. TRAFFIC DATA (CONTINUED)

The volume of traffic using School Lane to avoid the roundabouts on the A1042 was thought to be part of the problem.

It was questioned as to how enforceable a 20mph speed limit was.

Mr W F Couzens agreed to raise Council's concerns regarding speed of traffic on School Lane at the Community Police meeting.

(4) St. Mary and St. Margaret's estate 2022 May - both directions

It was noted that whilst a majority of vehicles were travelling within the 30mph speed limit those exceeding it were leaving the estate.

There was discussion regarding the fact St. Mary and St Margarets estate and Chenery Drive did not have the same 20mph speed limit as all other residential roads in Sprowston.

Mr W F Couzens had informed those residents requesting a change of speed limit that SAM2 data was available on Council's website and the matter was to be discussed at this meeting. He would deliver the additional data now available to them.

Mrs B J Lashley noted Council had already requested a 20mph zone but Norfolk County Council Highways had refused.

As the data did not demonstrate excessive speeding it was felt unlikely that Norfolk County Council would support a reduction in the speed limit.

RESOLVED to measure traffic speed in six months to ascertain if there was any change.

22/170. DISABLED PARKING SPACE AND TURNING SPACE AT ST. MARY AND ST. MARGARETS

Council considered proposed draft plans for paths and parking at St Mary and St Margaret's and raised a number of questions with regard to who would pay for the works, ongoing maintenance, possible movement of monuments, location of the turning space for hearses and location of parking spaces.

Mrs J Leggett proposed, seconded by Mrs K Vincent that a meeting be arranged with Reverend Canon Simon Stokes, Mr W F Couzens, Mrs B J Lashley and Mrs J Leggett to discuss further details of the proposed draft plans. On being put to the vote the motion was CARRIED.

20220891 - placement of an electric vehicle charging point at 16, War Memorial Bungalows, Gristock, Mousehold Lane, Sprowston.

(b) to oppose the granting of planning application 20220782 - variation of condition 3 of planning permission 20201880 - revisions to layout at Land South of Salhouse Road on the grounds of a reduction of affordable housing, being the replacement of 8 affordable flats in favour of 2 five-bedroom houses at full market value.

(c) whilst not opposed to planning application 22/00610/F - erection of a freestanding restaurant with drive-thru facility, car parking, landscaping and associated works, including Customer Order Displays (COD) and Play Frame (Class E/Sui Generis at Land at Mousehold Lane, Norwich, request the following points be taken into account when a determination is made:

22/176. PLANNING (CONTINUED)

1. Town Council supports the Norfolk County Council Highways holding objection and further asks that safe vehicular access onto Mousehold Lane is assured for residents using Corbet Avenue, Blackwell Avenue, Alford Grove, Oaktree Drive, Playford Road and Moorland Close.
2. Part of the site shares a boundary with Mousehold Heath. The heath is a well-known habitat for bats. Town Council requests any lighting visible from the Mousehold Heath side of this site should be of a type that is not disruptive to bats. Furthermore, any lighting on this side of the site should not be switched on 24 hours a day (i.e., it should be switched off at the times when artificial lighting is most likely to interfere with bat activity).
3. Town Council acknowledges Mousehold Heath is not within Sprowston's boundary, but is nonetheless concerned about a possible increase in littering within this sensitive natural area, which is enjoyed by many Sprowston residents. Council notes the application makes reference to regular litter picking in Mousehold Heath within 150 metres of the proposed restaurant. Council suggests this area is insufficient and requests litter picking be extended to cover as wide an area of Mousehold Heath as practicable.
4. Town Council requests that any disruption experienced by nearby residents, as caused by noise, odour, traffic and light pollution be mitigated by restricting restaurant opening hours not beyond midnight.

Exploratory excavations previously carried out identified a drain servicing some sinks was not connected to the main foul water drainage. This work was to excavate a trench, lay a new foul water drainage pipe insert a chamber, connect up to the existing drainage system and backfill.

Mrs K Vincent left the meeting.

On the motion of Mr J F Fisher, seconded by Mrs J Leggett it was **RESOLVED** that payment of the accounts to 15 June 2022 totalling £15,755.13 be approved and the schedule authorising payment signed by Mr W F Couzens and Mrs B J Lashley.

Dear Mr Guy Ranaweera

You'll hopefully be aware, following my last email, that a report on our Norwich Western Link project and its latest projected cost is due to be considered by me and my fellow cabinet members on the county council when we meet on Monday 4 July. This report has been published on our website this afternoon and provides details of how the design of the road has been developed in light of the findings of our 2021 bat surveys. A section of the route at its northern end, including the viaduct over the River Wensum, has been refined as a result and I've attached an image which shows how this section of the road could look once built. This is the first time we've been able to share a detailed visualisation of the road and I hope it's of interest to people, it certainly is to me.

We've needed to take the time to develop the design of the road and the timetable we were previously working to has been updated in light of this. The revised timetable, which as ever is subject to gaining all necessary statutory approvals, sets out that construction would start in late 2024 and the road would open for use in late 2026. The budget for the project has also been revised, in part due to this additional design work but also due to other factors, such as the significant rises in inflation we've all been seeing. As a result, the overall cost of the project is now anticipated to be £251 million.

When the economic benefits the road would create are calculated the Norwich Western Link is still considered to be 'high' value for money according to Department for Transport criteria, which means we still have an excellent case for gaining investment in the project. Indeed, we would be asking central government to fund 85% of the total updated cost, which would mean £213 million of national investment in Norfolk. The local contribution to deliver the project would rise £7.9 million to £37.7 million.

Cost increases are never welcome but it's the right thing to do to update the budget now and to take account of the global issues that are pushing prices up. I and my cabinet colleagues will consider all the details presented in this cabinet report carefully and, if you would like to do the same, you can read it [here](#) on our website.

What remains unchanged is the need to invest in - and attract investment into - Norfolk, including in its transport infrastructure. With projects like the Norwich Western Link, we have the opportunity to tackle existing traffic congestion and prevent it from getting worse due to planned growth, and this in turn creates so many knock-on benefits. From air quality, road safety and emergency response time improvements to supporting local businesses and making walking, cycling and public transport use more attractive and viable options, better infrastructure can make a huge difference to people's lives.

Because of this, I was really pleased to hear yesterday that the Secretary of State for Transport has given the green light to the long-awaited dualling of the A47 between North Burlingham and Blofield, which is currently a real bottleneck. Dualling this section will speed up journey times and improve road safety on this major trunk road, and I'm really looking forward to seeing it completed, due in a couple of years' time.

Getting back to the Norwich Western Link, I'll email you again following the cabinet meeting on Monday 4 July with a further update and let you know of the next steps based on the decisions made at the meeting.
